

VERBALS

Verbals are verb forms that function as other parts of speech.

GERUNDS

A gerund is a verb form that functions as a noun in a sentence.

Gerunds are created by adding the suffix -ing to the base form of a verb.

EXAMPLE:
Swimming is my favorite sport.

PARTICIPLES

A participle is a verb that functions as an adjective or a part of a verb phrase.

Present participle: ends in -ing; indicates ongoing action

Past participle: ends in -ed, -en, or is an irregular verb; used to form the perfect tense and passive voice

PRESENT PARTICIPLE EXAMPLE:
The running water is refreshing.

PAST PARTICIPLE EXAMPLE:
The broken vase needs to be replaced.

INFINITIVES

An infinitive is the base form of a verb, typically preceded by the

word "to." can act as nouns, adjectives, or adverbs

INFINITIVE EXAMPLE:
To travel is my dream!

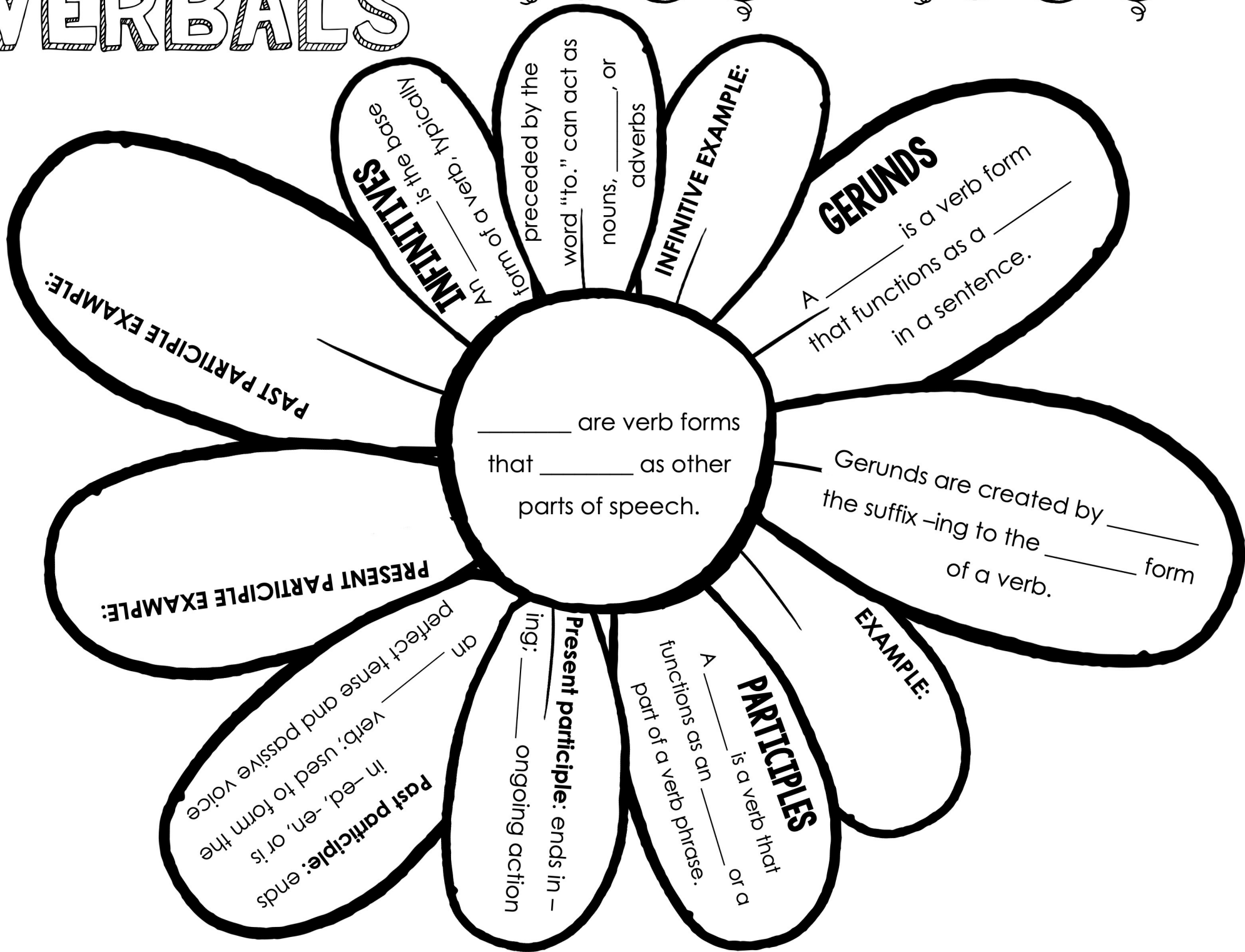
